

THIS SIDE UP Table

This side up. No, it's the other way around! THIS SIDE UP Table is a humorous side table that looks like a cardboard carton.

THIS SIDE UP Table looks like a box and, in some ways, it functions as one. It is lightweight and easy to move, allowing the user to hide things away underneath it should visitors turn up unexpectedly. Furthermore, magazines and remote controls can be slotted into the gaps between the side panels. This playful table is made with 5mm-thick aluminum sheet – a recyclable and sustainable material. It can be easily disassembled into five pieces, enabling compact transport.



In & Out Door

In & Out Door indicates whether to push or pull a door by encouraging users to press on a raised panel or pull on an inset handle.

It is not easy to distinguish whether to push or to pull most doors, which makes it difficult to use them intuitively. The "PUSH" or "PULL" markings are often small and do not draw immediate attention. There should be a solution that responds to this general condition and raises visibility.

In & Out Door encourages a pushing motion on one side of the door and a pulling motion on the other. It incorporates a push panel and a pull handle in a single set. The parts move together, and due to the action of an internal spring (which is attached to the push panel), the set returns to its original state after use. The push panel protrudes from the door surface and retracts to meet the door surface when pushed. The handle is set into the door and extracts outwards to meet the door surface when pulled. When either of these movements occurs, the door opens.
